Confession of Sin & Absolution

Pastor: When Jesus began calling his first disciples, he said, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the Gospel." (Mark 1:15) God has been our help in ages past. He is our hope for years to come. He, our eternal Lord, comes to us in his Word. It is the good news of Jesus' paying for our sins, and the resurrection proof that our heavenly Father accepted his sacrifice for us, that enables us to believe, confess, repent, and ask God to guide us in lives pleasing to him. Now is the time for us to draw near to our heavenly Father, asking him, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.

(Silence for self-examination and confession)

Pastor: Most merciful God, we confess that, like the prophet Jonah, we have, at times, refused to announce your mercy to the people around us when you gave us the opportunity.

People: Forgive us, heavenly Father.

Old Testament: Jonah 3:1-5, 10 (Nineveh repents.)

Lector: ¹ Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: ² "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you." ³ Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very large city; it took three days to go through it. ⁴ Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." ⁵ The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth… ¹⁰ When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he relented and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened. This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Epistle: I Corinthians 7:29-35 (We live in the end times.)

Lector: ²⁹ What I mean, brothers and sisters, is that the time is short. From now on, those who have wives should live as if they do not; ³⁰ those who mourn, as if they did not; those who are happy, as if they were not; those who buy something, as if it were not theirs to keep; ³¹ those who use the things of the world, as if not engrossed in them. For this world in its present form is passing away. ³² I would like you to be free from concern. An unmarried man is concerned about the Lord's affairs—how he can please the Lord. ³³ But a married man is concerned about the affairs of this world—how he can please his wife— ³⁴ and his interests are divided. An unmarried woman or virgin is concerned about the Lord's affairs: Her aim is to be devoted to the Lord in both body and spirit. But a married woman is concerned about the affairs of this world—how she can please her husband. ³⁵ I am saying this for your own good, not to restrict you, but that you may live in a right way, in undivided devotion to the Lord. This is the Word of the Lord.

Repent and believe the good news!" ¹⁶ As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother, Andrew, casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." ¹⁸ At once they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ When he had gone a little farther, he saw James, son of Zebedee, and his brother, John, in a boat, preparing their nets. ²⁰ Without delay he called them, and they left their father, Zebedee, in the boat with the hired men and followed him. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

STATEMENT ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper is celebrated in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord, as he says, gives not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:26, 28; I Corinthians 11:23-24). In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord, those are invited to his table who trust his word of promise, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. Because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a belief concerning the Lord's Supper that is different from the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are respectfully requested not to receive the sacrament in the service today. You may come forward for a blessing by crossing your arms across your chest, as an indication to the pastor. If you have questions regarding your participation, or would like to learn more, please speak to the pastor after the service. Thank you!

In preparing to receive Holy Communion, ask yourself these questions:

- 1. Am I sincerely sorry for my sins, and do I repent of them?
- 2. Do I confidently trust in Jesus Christ, my Lord and Savior, who died for me, paying for my sins, and rose again from the dead, to give me eternal life?
- 3. Do I believe that Jesus is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine in Holy Communion, and that I receive his true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and strengthening of faith?
- 4. Do I promise, with the Holy Spirit's help, to amend my sinful life, and to declare this resolve through Christian living, faithful worship, and careful stewardship of time, talent, and treasures?

5. Do I understand that by receiving the Lord's Supper in this congregation, I am declaring that the teaching of this congregation, a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, is also my own?

Attendance: Worship - 108 (93 and 15 online), one year ago - 136

As We Gather: In this first month of the new year, we become more aware of how quickly time passes. Yet each day includes opportunity for a fresh start, through repentance and renewal of faith. The ancient Ninevites responded to Jonah's warning and repented of their sins (Jonah 3:1-5, 10). Paul urges the Church to remember that it is living in the end times right now, in anticipation of Judgment Day (I Corinthians 7:29-35). And Jesus calls us to repent and believe in the Gospel each

time we hear his gracious good news (Mark 1:14-20). Our gathering today is a perfect time for repentant rejoicing!

Stewardship Standard: Mark 1:14-15 says, "Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." To repent means to turn away from sin and our former way of thinking and turn toward belief in God and his Gospel of grace and mercy. The Christian life is one of repentance and faith. Where is God calling you to repent today? How is he calling you to a deeper faith?

Order in the order—why we do what we do in Lutheran worship: In the KYRIE, we echo one of the oldest sections of the Christian liturgy. In it, we ask that God would never stop offering the mercy we treasure; the same mercy that was announced just moments ago in the Absolution. We recognize that we live only by God's mercy, and we pray for its constant presence among us.

Catechism

The Lord's Prayer: The 3rd petition and meaning – Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
