Confession of Sin & Absolution

Pastor: We are gathered to hear God’s Word, to call on him in prayer, and to receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. So, it is good that we reflect on our unworthiness, confess to God our sins of thought, word, and deed, and our helplessness to free ourselves from our sinful nature. It is also good that we remember who we are as the baptized children of God: a people to whom the Lord has shown mercy, cleansed from all our sin, and declared righteous because of Jesus. We again lay claim to this grace in which we are forgiven, and, for the sake of Christ, to be restored by his mercy to serve him and walk in his ways.

(Silence for examination and confession)

Pastor: We now confess our sins.

ALL: I confess to God almighty, before the whole company of heaven and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned in thought, word, and deed; by my fault, by my own fault, by my own most grievous fault. I pray God Almighty to have mercy on me, forgive me all my sins, and bring me to everlasting life. Amen.

Old Testament: Jeremiah 31:31-34 (A new covenant)

Lector: ³¹“The days are coming,” declares the LORD, “when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them,” declares the LORD. ³³This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time,” declares the LORD. “I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. ³⁴No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, ‘Know the LORD,’ because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest,” declares the LORD. “For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.” This is the Word of the Lord.

Epistle: Hebrews 5:1-10 (A priest forever)

Lector: ¹Every high priest is selected from among the people and is appointed to represent the people in matters related to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ²He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness. ³This is why he has to offer sacrifices for his own sins, as well as for the sins of the people. ⁴And no one takes this honor on himself, but he receives it when called by God, just as Aaron was. ⁵In the same way, Christ did not take on himself the glory of becoming a high priest. But God said to him, “You are my Son; today I have become your Father.” ⁶And he says in another place, “You are a priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek.” ⁷During the days

of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.⁸ Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered⁹ and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him¹⁰ and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek. This is the Word of the Lord.

Holy Gospel: Mark 10:35-45 (*True servant leadership*)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 10th chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

Pastor: ³⁵ Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.³⁷ They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."³⁸ "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"³⁹ "We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with,⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John.⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them."⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant,⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all.⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." This is the Word of the Lord.

STATEMENT ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper is celebrated in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord, as he says, gives not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:26, 28; I Corinthians 11:23-24). In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord, those are invited to his table who trust his word of promise, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. Because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a belief concerning the Lord's Supper that is different from the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are respectfully requested not to receive the sacrament in the service today. You may come forward for a blessing by crossing your arms across your chest, as an indication to the pastor. If you have questions regarding your participation, or would like to learn more, please speak to the pastor after the service. Thank you!

In preparing to receive Holy Communion, ask yourself these questions:

1. Am I sincerely sorry for my sins, and do I repent of them?
2. Do I confidently trust in Jesus Christ, my Lord and Savior, who died for me, paying for my sins, and rose again from the dead, to give me eternal life?
3. Do I believe that Jesus is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine in Holy Communion, and that I receive his true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and strengthening of faith?
4. Do I promise, with the Holy Spirit's help, to amend my sinful life, and to declare this resolve through Christian living, faithful worship, and careful stewardship of time, talent, and treasures?
5. Do I understand that by receiving the Lord's Supper in this congregation, I am declaring that the teaching of this congregation, a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, is also my own?

As We Gather: Have you ever tried to tell someone something important while they babble on about trivial things? Today, just a week from Palm Sunday, Jesus is trying to speak of what is soon to come. But the disciples were not listening. They were arguing over who is the greatest. Jesus stops their conversation in its tracks by bluntly speaking of his cross and describing the cross-shaped pattern of his life. He did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many. If you want to seek true greatness, the path you must follow will be shaped by the cross, and you will demonstrate the same servant attitude that Jesus has for you.

Stewardship Standard: Jesus says in Mark 10:45, "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Jesus gives everything he has. He gives himself. That self-giving is the model for our giving in all aspects of our life. In our family, in our congregation, and in the world at large, Jesus calls us to follow his example of self-giving. We can only do this if we are connected to his self-giving, by faith.

Order in the order—why we do what we do in Lutheran worship: The **OFFERING** is a response to the Good News that we just heard in the sermon. We joyfully offer our entire life in thanksgiving for all God has done for us. We symbolize this giving of our whole self to God through our offering.

Catechism

The Power of Baptism: Third – “How can water do such great things? Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God’s word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three: “He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying.” *Titus 3:5-8*
